Privacy Notice and Terms and Conditions

Privacy Notice

We take your privacy very seriously. The information you provide about yourself as part of this submission procedure will be used by BBC CWR to select your story for possible broadcast opportunity on BBC CWR's programmes. If you are successful, this information may be used in connection with the production and promotion of the programme.

We may use the information you provide to verify your age and identity and to carry out background checks with law enforcement and government agencies.

By submitting this story, you understand that any special category personal information that you provide (for example information relating to your health or criminal convictions) may be used for the purpose of verifying your suitability for the programme and if successful, for the production of the programme.

The BBC is the 'data controller' of the personal information you provide. This means that the BBC decides what your personal information is used for, and the ways in which it is processed. The legal basis on which the BBC processes your personal information is our legitimate interest in producing journalistic, academic, literary or artistic content. Where we process your personal information for our legitimate interests we will carefully consider and balance our interests in processing your data against any impact on your individual rights and freedoms and will not use your personal information where such impact overrides our interests. As part of your application we may process special category data e.g. information relating to your race or ethnicity, religious beliefs, political opinions, health and sexual preferences. We will process special category information for reasons of substantial public interest in producing journalistic content. For editorial reasons, we will archive the personal information of those selected to be part of the campaign after 2021. The personal data of those not selected will be deleted unless we agree to keep the data of those chosen to be a contributor.

If you raise a concern with the BBC about the way it has handled your personal information and you are dissatisfied with the BBC's response, you are entitled to lodge a concern with a supervisory authority. In the UK, the supervisory authority is the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO).

Terms and Conditions

You will need to be 18 or over before 9 March 2020 and be eligible to work in the UK. We may use the information you provide to verify your age and identity.

The 21 is not a paid opportunity. You will be responsible for meeting your own travel expenses to the studios.

BBC CWR will select The 21 based on editorial reasons, to reflect the geographic area, and full diversity of the city.

The BBC reserves the right to disqualify you if you have supplied untruthful, inaccurate or misleading personal details and/or information, have failed to abide by these terms and conditions.

During the process you will be filmed and have audio recorded by the BBC, and what's recorded may be used by the BBC for broadcast and/or appear on BBC online websites as well as official BBC social media accounts.

Those selected to be part of The 21 will be contacted, and name publicised on BBC radio, possibly TV and online. Unsuccessful auditionees will not be contacted. We are not able to answer any questions by email or otherwise about the auditions as all the information you require is on this page.
