

Activity 3: Story Endings - For ages 5 to 7

The ending is a very important part of your story. Below are some ideas for different types of endings, some which might work well (Writers Rock!) and some that you might want to avoid (Writer's Block):

Writer's Block...



The Fizzer Ending

The story fizzles out at the end.



The Random Ending

This ending doesn't make sense. It's like a giant foot just appears from nowhere and stomps on the story.



The Obvious Ending

Nothing unexpected happens. The reader can guess what's going to happen right from the start of the story, so there are no surprises.

Writers Rock!



The Reflective Ending

This type of ending looks at what has gone before and might share a lesson learned with the reader.



The Twist Ending

The ending to this story takes a surprising and unexpected twist.



The Dialogue Ending

This type of ending features two or more of the characters speaking which can help readers feel more connected to the story.
