CRIME SCENES SCOTLAND: FORENSICS SQUAD

Wednesday 9 October,
BBC One Scotland, 10.35pm

"I believe in Scotland we've been able to deliver a unique service" says Tom Nelson, Director of SPA Forensic Services.

19th century forensic pioneer Edmond Locard said: "Every contact leaves a trace". Today, forensic science catches more killers than ever.

Following a crime-scene-to-court format, three-part series *Crime Scenes Scotland: Forensics Squad* gains unique access to Scotland's world-class forensic scientists exploring the techniques used to solve some of Scotland's most notorious murders:

Programme One: TX Date

- **Angelika Kluk** (2006): 23-year-old Polish student Angelika Kluk was brutally raped and murdered by serial killer Peter Tobin in 2006, her body concealed in a void beneath the floor of St. Patrick's Church, Glasgow. Church handyman Tobin was found guilty of raping and murdering Kluk in 2007 and was sentenced to life imprisonment, to serve a minimum of 21 years. He was subsequently revealed as a serial killer and charged with the murders of Vicky Hamilton and Dinah McNicol.
- **Kriss Donald** (2004): 15-year-old schoolboy Kriss Donald was kidnapped, tortured and murdered in a unprovoked attack by an Asian gang in Glasgow's Pollokshields. Three of the gang then fled to Pakistan after the crime to evade justice. Daanish Zahid was first to face trial and, once extradited from Pakistan, Imran Shahid, Zeeshan Shahid, and Mohammed Faisal Mustaq were also found guilty of racially motivated murder – the first conviction of this kind in Scottish legal history.

Programme Two: TX Date

- **Moira Jones** (2008): 40-year-old businesswoman Moira Jones was abducted, beaten, raped and murdered in Glasgow's Queens Park, just yards from her home. Her body was discovered the following morning by a park ranger. Slovakian Marek Harcar was jailed in April 2009 for at least 25 years for Moira's murder, following his attempts to evade capture by fleeing to the Czech Republic and then Slovakia.
- **Eleni Pachou** (2008): Hard-working 25-year-old Eleni came to Scotland from Greece to start a new life following the death of her mother. Working as a trainee manager in a popular west end pizzeria in Glasgow, Eleni was viciously stabbed to death for one night's takings (£1320.55) by former colleague Juan Carlos Crispin whose lover, the restaurant's cleaner Marion Hinshelwood was convicted of culpable homicide. On the night of the murder, Crispin turned up at the restaurant as Eleni was locking up, striking after tricking his way in.

Programme Three: TX Date

- **Jolanta Bledaite** (2008): Lithuanian Jolanta Bledaite, 35, was murdered in cold blood for her savings by Vitas Plytnykas and Aleksandras Skirda before cutting off her head and hands and dumping them along with her torso in the sea off Arbroath Harbour. The killers planned what they thought was the perfect murder. They bound, gagged, tortured and murdered the migrant worker at the flat she shared with Skirda in Brechin, Angus.
- **Carol Jarvis** (2009): Carol Jarvis, 47, from Bathgate was murdered by her husband, Harry, her body hidden under the floorboards of their West Lothian home. His lover, Rita Heyster, who lived in a shed in the garden of the Jarvis' marital home was convicted of helping to conceal the murder.
- **John Kennedy** (2012): 63-year-old John Kennedy from Dundee was stabbed to death by his 44-year-old neighbour, Michael Nolan in April 2012. Nolan inflicted 82 knife wounds on his neighbour for reasons that remain unknown.

Featuring forensic evidence and interviews with Tom Nelson, Director of SPA Forensic Services; Forensic Scientists Carol Weston, Pauline McSorley and Ruth Ramage; Forensic Pathologist, Marjorie Turner; Crime Scene Examiner Michael Young; Police Scotland detectives Derek Robertson and Robbie Allan; and Donald Findlay QC, amongst others, *Crime Scenes Scotland: Forensics Squad* is a Glasgow Films production for BBC Scotland.

Keeping his promise to Nicole, Gabriel goes in search of Gareth but is shocked when DCI Donald announces he's been found dead.

Leyla returns to Shieldinch to support new mum Nicole but she's distracted by thoughts of Gareth. Gabriel reluctantly breaks the news of Gareth's death to a devastated Nicole who admits she feared the worst – Gareth would never just leave them.

Nicole reveals to Gabriel and Leyla that Gareth turned police informant before he died, further fuelling Gabriel's suspicion about Billy and the danger he poses to the Brodies'.

Following a crime-scene-to-court format, *Crime Scenes Scotland: Forensics Squad* gains unique access to Scotland's world-class forensic scientists by exploring the techniques used to solve notorious Scottish murders.

Statistically, Scotland has Western Europe's worst murder rate per capita. However, the country's compact size has led to a globally unique forensic service provided by the SPA (Scottish Police Authority) to support the work of Police Scotland and the wider criminal justice community. This three-part series examines the role forensics played in solving high-profile Scottish murder cases including Angelika Kluk, Kriss Donald, Moira Jones, Eleni Pachou and Jolanta Bledaite.

Revealing detailed forensic evidence, and featuring interviews with the crime teams, *Crime Scenes Scotland: Forensics Squad* examines the anatomy of murder, through the eyes of forensic scientists. Carol Weston, SPA Senior Forensic Scientist says: "Although you see a lot of dead people, you treat everyone as an individual with respect and with humanity."

The first programme opens the case files of Angelika Kluk and Kriss Donald – two brutal murders which shocked Scotland.

Polish student Angelika Kluk was brutally raped and murdered in 2006, her body dumped under the floorboards of St Patrick's Roman Catholic Church, Glasgow. As *Crime Scenes Scotland: Forensics Squad* highlights, the SPA played a key role in identifying the prime suspect Peter Tobin, later revealing him to be a ruthless serial killer.

In 2004, 15-year-old schoolboy Kriss Donald was kidnapped, tortured and murdered in an unprovoked attack by an Asian gang in Glasgow's Pollokshields. As the horrific details of Kriss' murder unfolded, three of the fugitives went on the run to Pakistan. The remaining two gang members were quickly caught and convicted.

But it took a one-time extradition deal with Pakistan to return the chief perpetrators to face trial. Assisted by unique forensic telephony techniques, three more convictions were secured, culminating in a first in Scottish Legal history for a racially-motivated killing.
