

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

BBC Radio Manchester - Phil Trow's Definitions Quiz

Terms and Conditions

1. Entry is open to all UK residents (including Channel Islands and the Isle of Man), except BBC employees or those of its affiliates and their close relatives or any person connected to the competition. Proof of age, identity and eligibility may be requested.
2. The competition will be played every week day in Phil Trow's show from 19 March 2018 (except when editorial requirements lead to a change in schedule or a change in programme content).
3. During the show, the presenter will open the lines for the Definitions Quiz with a qualifying question. Listeners will be invited to enter the competition and answer the question:
 - Calling the number: 0161 228 2255. Standard geographic charges from landlines and mobiles will apply.No other method of entry will be accepted. Only one entry is allowed per listener per day. Callers under 16 years of age will need the permission of a parent or guardian to enter.
4. Entry is only open during the times announced on-air. The opening and closing times may change so please listen to announcements during the show.
5. When listeners telephone to enter, a member of the production team will ask them their name, location and a contact telephone number as well as their answer to the qualifying question.
6. The BBC will collect your personal information for the purpose of administering this competition. The BBC will also collect postal address information of winners where necessary to fulfil the prize. The BBC processes your information on the basis of our legitimate interests in running listener competitions of this nature. We will retain this information for as long as is necessary to fulfil these purposes at which point the information will be deleted from BBC records. Your personal data will not be shared with any third party without your prior permission. 7. The BBC will select at random a caller with the correct answer to the qualifying question and put them on air to play the quiz – answering as many questions in one minute. One point will be given for each correct answer.
8. Listeners taking part in the on-air competition must ensure that they are available on the telephone number provided to take the call from the production team. If an entrant is not available after reasonable attempts by the production team, another correct entrant will be selected at random to play.

9. On Friday, after the fifth listener has played – the winner will be the person from that week's rounds who has the highest number of points earned in their minute. The prize will be as described on air so please listen carefully to the announcements. In the event of a tie, the winner will be the person with the fewest number of wrong answers.
10. There is no cash alternative and the prize cannot be sold or transferred in any circumstances.
11. Winners are not permitted to re-enter the competition for a period of 6 weeks.
12. Entrants must agree to take part in any post-competition publicity if required.
13. The BBC's decision as to prizes awarded is final. No correspondence relating to the quiz will be entered into.
14. The BBC reserves the right to: (i) amend these terms and conditions; (ii) disqualify any entrant who breaches the rules or has acted fraudulently in any way; and (iii) where applicable, take any entrant off-air, disqualify the entrant, withdraw or substitute any prize, at any stage, should any entrant, winner or their guest exhibit inappropriate or dangerous behaviour (including, but not limited to being under the influence of alcohol, illegal drugs or chemical substances or causing a nuisance) while on air or attending BBC premises.
15. The BBC reserves the right to cancel the competition, at any stage, if in its opinion it is deemed necessary, for editorial reasons or if circumstances arise outside its control.
16. The BBC, its sub-contractors, subsidiaries and/or agencies cannot accept any responsibility whatsoever for any technical failure or malfunction or any other problem which may result in any entry being lost or not properly registered.
