



## PARTY – Part 1

**to come over, to join in, to get down**

### Part 1 conversation:

VICKI: Let's have a BBC Learning English party!

MATT: Yeah, why don't you **come over** and **join in**?

VICKI: Even if you can't **come over** here, you can still **join in** with our party!

MATT: Ooooooh I like this song (VICKI) – come on – let's dance!

VICKI: This is a great song to dance to. And the lyrics even say '**get down**' which means to dance.

MATT: Yeah it's quite informal and you hear it a lot in songs, especially in American English. Hey - look at Paul, **he's really getting down**.

### Part 1 examples:

1. to come over. I love entertaining. People often come over to dinner at my house.
2. to join in. At the concert, we all joined in with the singing.
3. to get down. I'm not very good at dancing, but you just can't help getting down to some good music.
