

## BBC Radio Cornwall – David White’s Music Quiz – April 2022 onwards

### Terms and Conditions

1. The competition is open to all residents of the UK, including the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, except BBC or BBC Group employees, or their immediate family and anyone connected with the competition. Entrants under the age of 16 will need parental permission to take part. The BBC reserves the right to check permissions.

2. The competition will be played during regular episodes of The David White Show on BBC Radio Cornwall (except when editorial requirements lead to a change in schedule or a change in programme content).

3. The presenter will announce the time at which people can register to take part with a thirty minutes window by calling for free on 0808 100 1039.

- Names and telephone numbers will be written in a list. Listeners will be selected at random and invited to go live on-air to have a go at the game. No other method of entry will be accepted.

- The contestant will be asked to choose their specialist area – music of the 60s, 70s, 80s, 90s and music from the movies. They will be asked three questions including general knowledge and track intros.

- The contestant will be given one lifeline - the chance to ask for help from the audience. The audience will have the length of a song to offer their suggestions via WhatsApp. The contestant then chooses which suggestion to go for. No additional prizes are available for the audience members offering help.

- Three correct answers are needed to win a prize which will be as described on air.

- Contestants who get all three questions correct will be offered the chance to win a second prize with a bonus question. The specialist area will be chosen by random selection. A correct answer is needed to win a further prize as described on air.

4. Entry is only open during the times announced on-air. Entries received outside these times will not be registered. The opening and closing times may change so please listen to announcements during the programme.

5. The winner and entrants must ensure that they are available on the telephone number provided to take the call from the production team. If an entrant is not available after reasonable attempts by the production team, another name from the registration list will be selected at random.

6. The prize is as described on air. There is no cash alternative and the prize cannot be sold or transferred in any circumstances.

7. The BBC reserves the right to prevent putting an entrant on air or take any entrant off-air, and disqualify them from the competition at any time if they display offensive, abusive or any other kind of behaviour unsuitable for broadcast.

8. Entrants must agree to take part in any post-competition publicity if required.

9. The BBC's decision as to prizes awarded is final. No correspondence relating to the competition will be entered into.

10. The BBC reserves the right to: (i) amend these terms and conditions including, but not limited to, the competition opening and closing times; (ii) disqualify any entrant who breaches the rules, has acted fraudulently in any way or has brought (in the BBC's sole discretion) the BBC into disrepute; (iii) cancel the competition, at any stage, if in its opinion it is deemed necessary or if circumstances arise outside its control.

11. Listeners who give three correct answers to win a prize cannot take part for one month.

12. Listeners who get to air but do not win a prize cannot do so again for two weeks.

13. The BBC, its sub-contractors, subsidiaries and/or agencies cannot accept any responsibility whatsoever for any technical failure or malfunction or any other problem which may result in any entry being lost or not properly registered.

14. This competition accords with the BBC's Code of Conduct for Competitions and Voting

15. Entrants will be deemed to have accepted these rules and to agree to be bound by them when registering.

16. The competition is run by the BBC. The applicable law is that of England and Wales.

## David White's Music Quiz Privacy Notice

Your trust is very important to us. This means the BBC is committed to protecting the privacy and security of your personal data. It is important that you read this notice so that you are aware of how and why we are using such personal data. This privacy notice describes how we collect and use personal data about you during and after your relationship with us, in accordance with data protection law.

### **Why are we doing this and how can you participate?**

BBC Radio Cornwall is hosting a prize giveaway competition for the David White Show. The presenter will invite the audience to call in to register their interest to take part in the quiz. Random selection will be used to select one caller to answer three music-based questions to be in with a chance of winning a prize, which will be announced on the show.

The prize giveaway competition is open to participants of all ages. If you are under the age of 16 and wish to take part, you will need parental permission to enter, and we'll ask to speak to your parent or guardian to get their permission and contact information.

You can take part in the competition by calling 0808 100 1039. Participants will be selected at random and invited to go live on the David White Show to have a go at the game. If participants fail to give three correct answers, they cannot register to take part for a further two weeks.

The BBC will collect your personal data for the purposes of administering the competition. Once you call in, the BBC will collect your personal data via an online platform.

If we broadcast your contribution, this may include the programme being available online and/or on demand, and your contribution may be used again in a future broadcast.

We may use your contribution for promotional purposes on the BBC's social media sites.

### **What personal data will BBC collect and how will we use it?**

The BBC will collect and process the personal data for the purposes of running the competition, so that we can randomly select a contestant for the quiz, and to send winning entrants their prize.

#### **Personal data:**

We will collect the following **personal data**:

- Name
- Phone number
- Confirmation you're over or under 16

If you are under 16, we'll also collect your parent/guardians name and contact telephone phone number.

If you win the competition, we will also collect and process your full address to send you your prize.

### **Who is the Data Controller?**

The BBC is the "data controller" of your personal data. This means that the BBC decides what your personal data is used for, and the ways in which it is processed. For the avoidance of doubt, your personal data will be collected and processed solely for the purposes set out in this privacy notice. As the data controller, the BBC has the responsibility to comply, and to demonstrate compliance with, data protection law.

### **Lawful basis for processing your personal data**

The lawful basis on which the BBC processes the personal data is the performance of its **public task**. The BBC's role is to act in the public interest and to serve all audiences with content which informs, educates and entertains.

### **Sharing your personal data**

The BBC works with our approved third-party providers who help us to provide some of our services. These partners only use your personal data on behalf of the BBC and not independently of the BBC.

We may share personal data with a third party where required or permitted by law.

### **Retaining your personal data**

We keep records of winners and runners-up for two (2) years for auditing and compliance purposes.

If your contribution is used for broadcast, your personal data will be retained and archived in perpetuity by the BBC.

All other entrants' personal data will be held for a period of six (6) months after entry.

If your contribution is used for broadcast, your personal data will be retained and archived in perpetuity by the BBC.

Your personal data will be stored in the UK and the EEA.

### **Your rights and more information**

You have **rights** under data protection law:

- You can **request a copy** of the personal data BBC stores about you.
- You have the right to ask for the personal data we collect about you to be **deleted** however there are limitations and exceptions to this right which may entitle the BBC to refuse your request.
- In certain circumstances, you have the right to **restrict** the processing of your personal data or to **object** to the processing of your personal data.
- You have the right to ask that we **transfer** the personal data to you or to another organisation, in certain circumstances.
